
October 5th Meeting: Lecture With Diamond Jim Tyler

Editor: Tell us something interesting about yourself that we might not know?


Don: Started to play the drums also in 1964, played in several rock bands & still continue to play at several St. Louis drum circles.

The lecture series continued with Steve Bender "What's New in Magic", Paul Gertner "Original instructions NOT included", Eric Buss "Imagine Yourself - Some Tricks, Thoughts and Fun!". The winner of the "Close-Up Contest" was Steve Finkelstein, second place was awarded to Bill Walsh. Our Friday Evening Show "Magic Parade" had Dan Harlan as Emcee. Mike Niehaus, Tony Pezo, Simon Lovell, and Andrew Goldenhersh provided an incredible night of magic. After the show Arthur Stead continued the lecture series with "Give Your Act a Music Makeover". Finally, Simon Lovell finished the day with his lecture "Confessions of a Cheat".



We started Saturday morning with Richard Turner's lecture "Living on Jacks and Queens". Shawn Farquhar continued the lecture series with "Bread & Butter". Exhausted and overwhelmed the conventioners attended a mind-blowing "Close-Up Show" featuring Eugene Burger, Shawn Farquhar, Paul Gertner, Dan Harlan, Simon Lovell, Arthur Stead and Richard Turner. Eugene Burger then ended the lecture series with "Creating More Impact with our Magic". Finally, the convention came to a close with the Saturday Night Evening Show "The Stars of Magic!".
